










Sixty-two years of friendship: Mal with Dean West in Durham, 2019



FRIENDS FOR LIFE One picture captures a lifetime of ministry: (left to right) George Elliott, who was in the first club in Charlotte after Mal's return from seminary, Chip Milner from the Dykes "wild bunch" in Atlanta, and Dick and Don Samuels from Mal's Monrovia days. Three cities—Monrovia, Charlotte, and Atlanta—and three eras of direct ministry—the 50s, 60s, and 70s.
